

Regulation (EU) 2017/821 – 3TG

4.1 National Competent Authority4.2 Regulation (EU) 2017/821





Regulation (EU) 2017/821 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 17 May 2017, establishing supply chain due diligence obligations for Union importers of tin, tantalum and tungsten and their minerals, and of gold, originating in conflict-affected or high-risk areas

Mandatory Due Diligence Obligations for Union importers from 1 January 2021

Ministry of Economic Development - National Competent Authority Responsible for ex-post checks on the compliance with the obligations set by the Regulation

Law No. 117 of 4 October 2019 - Delegation to the Government for the transposition of European directives and the implementation of other EU acts (including regulation (EU) 2017/821).

- Legislative decree scheme setting provisions for the adaptation of national legislation for the implementation of the Regulation (EU) 2017/821
- Consultations with the competent Administrations:, Presidency of the Council of Ministries in charge of the European Affairs, Ministry of Foreign affairs and international cooperation, Ministry of Economy and Finance, Ministry of Justice, and Customs and Monopoly Agency
- The decree scheme obtained a favorable opinion from the Chamber and the Senate committees



Ali Enterprises Factory Fire Affectees Association (AEFFAA) et al. / RINA Services S.p.A. (11/9/2018)

- Agreement not reached (Conciliator's Report of 16/4/2019)
- Final Declaration published (11/12/2020)
- Request for the preparation of a Report on the development of the activities on the ground to be submitted within one year from the publication of the Final Declaration

During Follow-up:

Chima Williams & Associates (CWA) et al. / ENI S.p.A. (15/12/2017)

- Agreement signed on the 8/7/2019
- Start of drainage works
- Publications of the Report (19/11/2020) and its withdrawal due to dissent between the parties
- The NCP tries to favor a solution
